

ARTICLE XI

HALL OF FAME & HALL OF HONOR

SELECTION PROCEDURES

11.01 PURPOSE:

- (a) To honor those men and women who played a major role in the growth and development of softball in the State of Colorado.
- (b) To help bring to the attention of the public the widespread value of, and interest in, the game of softball by so honoring those who have made outstanding contributions to the game.

11.02: NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS:

- (a) An Individual shall be considered for nomination to the Colorado ASA Softball Hall of Fame of the Colorado ASA Hall of Honor based on their contribution to the game of softball in the State of Colorado.
- (b) The person so nominated must have been a resident of the State of Colorado at the time of his/her contribution to the game.
- (c) Players must have played a minimum of ten (10) years of softball in the State of Colorado.
- (d) Managers must have served as a manger for a minimum of ten (10) years in the game of softball in the State of Colorado.
- (e) Umpires must have served as an umpire for a minimum of ten (10) years in the State of Colorado.
- (f) Commissioners must have served a minimum of ten (10) years in the State of Colorado.
- (g) Meritorious Service: This honor may be bestowed upon an individual at the discretion of the Hall of Fame/Honor Committee.

11.03: NOMINATIONS:

- (a) Nominations for the Colorado ASA Hall of Fame or the Colorado ASA Hall of Honor may be made by any past or present member of the CASA. A candidate summary letter must be submitted to the committee chairperson no later than January 1st. The candidates summary or suggested format may be obtained from any committee member or the CASA office.
- (b) Nominations must include factually and detailed information such a scrapbooks, newspaper clippings, letters, references, etc.
- (c) Those individuals not considered may be resubmitted the following year unless held over by the Colorado ASA Hall of Fame/Honor Committee due to technicality.

11.04: AWARDS:

- (a) A specially designed plaque shall be presented to those elected to the Colorado ASA Hall of Fame or the Colorado ASA Hall of Honor.
- (b) A specially designed plaque shall be displayed in the State ASA Office in honor of members.

11.05: PRESENTATION:

- (a) Announcement of selected individuals will be officially made at the Annual CASA State Meeting.
- (b) A maximum of three (3) individuals may be inducted into the Hall of Fame or Hall of Honor annually. In addition, one individual may be inducted into each Hall posthumously.

11.06: COMMITTEE:

- (a) The Colorado ASA Hall of Fame/Honor Committee shall consist of nine (9) members appointed by the President.
- (b) Each year three (3) members will be appointed for a term of three (3) years and the three (3) senior members shall complete their term on the committee.
- (c) The Chairman of the committee shall prepare and mail to each Committee Member a copy of all properly submitted candidate summary forms at least seventy-five days prior to the CASA Annual State Meeting. Nominations will be voted on by the Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the CASA Annual State Meeting.
- (d) The Committee will be responsible for actively seeking out those individuals qualified for nomination to the Colorado ASA Hall/Honor.
- (e) The CASA President may appoint a replacement committee member for any committee member for the remainder of their term when their position has been abanded through inactivity.
- (f) The Committee shall help bring to the attention of the public and news media those selected for induction to the Hall of Fame/Honor.
- (g) The Committee shall see to the maintenance and care of the Colorado ASA Hall of Fame/Honor facility and have authority as to what is on display.

11.07: REMOVAL:

- (a) The Colorado ASA Hall of Fame/Honor Committee may by two-thirds (2/3) vote, with just cause, recommend the removal of an inductee. Such recommendations must than be approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the CASA Executive Board.
